

## EXECUTIVE BRANCH

### President

The Chief executive officer of ASUCD, who is the official representative to all government bodies and agencies as well as the campus and system-wide administration.

### Vice President

### Controller

## LEGISLATIVE BRANCH

### ASUCD Senate

354 Memorial Union ~ The legislative body of ASUCD represents all undergraduates attending UC Davis regarding student issues. The ASUCD Senate also has oversight over internal ASUCD fiscal matters.

**ASUCD Commissions are subordinate bodies of the ASUCD Senate that reviews legislation and make recommendations to the ASUCD Senate. They also work on projects within their respective categories.**

**ASUCD Scholarship Committee** and **Champagne Committee** recognizes students and members of UC Davis and ASUCD. The **Scholarship Committee** distributes scholarships twice a year to UC Davis students and the **Champagne Committee** distributes an award to ASUCD employees at the end of spring quarter.

### Academic Affairs Commission (AAC)

Investigates and recommends ASUCD programs and policies in areas of Academic Affairs at UC Davis and throughout the University of California.

### Business and Finance Commission (B&F)

Oversees the fiscal well being of ASUCD by conducting unit audits and reviews allocations of funds.

### Environmental Policy and Planning Commission (EPPC)

Researches environmental issues and concerns affecting the campus and the surrounding areas and coordinates campus-wide environmental awareness efforts.

### Ethnic and Cultural Affairs Commission (ECAC)

Investigates and recommends policies and programs concerning the ethnic and cultural community at UC Davis.

### External Affairs Commission (EAC)

Researches local, state, and national issues and achieves rapport with off-campus public bodies that affect students.

### Gender and Sexuality Commission (GASC)

Promotes awareness of gender and sexuality issues through events with campus organizations and recommends policies concerning gender and sexuality.

### Internal Affairs Commission (IAC)

Oversees ASUCD's Bylaws and Constitution, writes Long-Range Plans for all ASUCD units, reviews ASUCD membership in external organizations and works on ad hoc projects pertaining to student life.

### Outreach Assembly (OA)

Helps bridge the separation between campus clubs and ASUCD Student Government, often collaborating within student activities, as well as inform ASUCD of student organization activities.

### Elections Committee

Ensures the smooth and fair administration of the ASUCD elections and coordinates publicity to encourage student involvement in all aspects of the election process.

### Student-Police Relations Committee

Works to strengthen the relationship between the greater student population and local law enforcement agencies through education and advocacy.

## JUDICIAL BRANCH

### ASUCD Court

The ultimate authority in interpreting the wording of the ASUCD Constitution, Bylaws, and legislation enacted pursuant to the Constitution upon request of any UC Davis undergraduate student.
